

Performance Audit (PA) Programme 2023-2027

The OAG's Purchase Agreement states that we will produce 3-5 reports for the Parliament's Public Audit Committee (PAC) each year (including a general report on the financial audits, performance audits and public interest reports). However, the OAG usually plans to publish more than 5 reports a year.

The OAG reviews and updates the PA programme annually. In election years, we review and update it after the new Government is in place and the Strategic Policy Statement (with Government's priorities) has been issued so that we can ensure that the programme will add value. The programme was updated in July 2021 after the new Cayman Islands' Government's Strategic Policy Statement for 2022 – 2024 was published. The OAG revised the programme in Q3 of 2022 and consulted with the Parliament's Public Accounts Committee, the Senior Leadership Team in the Cayman Islands Government and the general public in November and December 2022. **This programme confirms the performance audits that will be published and/or started in 2023**. These are indicated in normal font. New audits started in 2023 may not be completed before the end and will be carried forward to 2024 and published in that year.

The programme also provides an indication of performance audit outputs that are proposed for 2024 to 2027. These are indicated in italics. Please note that these are proposals only at this stage and will be subject to further consultation and consideration. It is also worth noting that 2025 is an election year; the OAG will plan to meet its Purchase Agreement output targets in election years but may plan to publish fewer reports than in other years.
