

The OAG's Purchase Agreement states that we will produce 3-5 reports for the Parliament's Public Audit Committee (PAC) each year. This includes a general report on the financial audits, performance audits and public interest reports. The OAG usually plans to publish more than five reports a year.

The OAG reviews and updates the Performance Audit (PA) programme annually. We reviewed and updated the programme in the third quarter of 2022 and consulted with H.E. The Governor, the PAC and the Senior Leadership Team in the Cayman Islands Government in late 2023 and early 2024. We have taken on board the feedback received from these stakeholders.

We aim to align our PA programme with the Government's priorities to demonstrate how we add value. This programme aligns our confirmed and proposed performance audits with the strategic broad outcomes (SBO) and specific outcomes set out in the 2024-26 Strategic Policy Statement (SPS). The 2024-26 SPS sets five SBOs and 20 specific outcomes, which may contribute to more than one SBO. These specific outcomes are supported by a range of projects, initiatives and programmes. Please note that some performance audits align with several specific outcomes and more than one SBO. For the purposes of this programme, we have allocated each PA to one specific outcome. We will determine which specific outcomes and SBOs each performance audit aligns with more fully during the planning stage of each audit.

This programme confirms the performance audits that we plan to publish or start in the 12 months from May 2024.

The programme also provides an indication of performance audits and public interest reports that are proposed for 2025 to 2028. These are indicated in italics. Please note that these are proposals only at this stage and will be subject to further consultation and consideration. It is also worth noting that 2025 is an election year; the OAG will plan to meet its Purchase Agreement output targets in election years but may plan to publish fewer reports than in other years
